Notice of Retirement

I am resigning to begin my retirement. In October I turn 69 years old, and Beth and I would like to travel. I have been the Town Manager for more than 11 years. I have lived in Town for 10 years. You have made this a great place to live. I encourage you to continue to provide the leadership we truly need at this time. I thank you for your support of me during my tenure as the Town Manager.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my time as the Town Manager of Lake Clarke Shores. I cannot thank you enough for your support, leadership, and vision in making this community an amazing place to live, work, and play. As you know, we have a lot going on. I suggest beginning the search for a new Manager right away. I will commit to staying with the Town through the selection process and for a few weeks after the new Manager starts to help provide for a smooth transition.

Termination or Resignation is covered in my Employment Agreement in Section 5(d). Section 5(d) stipulates I provide a 60-day notice of my intent to resign. Section 18, Notices, says I have to hand deliver the notice. Please consider this my 60-day notice of resignation as the Town Manager.

Pine Tree Bridge Next Steps

We are working with FDOT on plan review and approval associated with the construction of the bridge and grant authorization. We have a meeting with FDOT staff, our design team, and Town staff in Ft. Lauderdale on August 3rd. We have responded to comments from their design review group already. As soon as we have design approval, we expect to have an agreement to execute (by the FDOT and the Town Council), then we will publicly bid the Pine Tree Bridge replacement project. Once the Town Council has approved the agreement with the lowest cost responsive and responsible

contractor, we will issue a notice to proceed and the contractor will start construction. This project is currently shovel ready.

During the 2022 Legislative Session, the Florida House included a new initiative in the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 General Appropriations Act (State Budget) for a Local Support Grants Program. We submitted two requests to our Representative David Silvers for the monies from Speaker Sprowls' new program. We submitted a request for \$1.7M for Mediterranean Neighborhood Water Quality Improvement Project (#22) with a 100% match. We also submitted a request for \$500,000 for Lake Clarke Aquatic Vegetation Removal (#41) with a 100% match. We got these requests in early. Representative Silvers is working these requests for us in Tallahassee.

Panel Presentation on Small Cities Doing More @ FLC

Lake Clarke Shores is seen by our peers as a small community that just seem to make things happen. I have been asked to join a panel of other small cities to discuss how we have been so successful. The session title is Doing More With Less – Solutions for Small Cities. I believe it is on Friday afternoon during the Florida League of Cities Annual Conference (August 12th).

Florida Resiliency and Energy District

As you remember, in 2016, we partnered with Fernandina Beach to create a Property Assessed Clean Energy independent special district called FRED. We added the Florida Development Finance Corporation (FDFC) as our limited partner and administrative group. The Executive Director of FDFC is also the Executive Director of FRED. Mr. Bill Spivey was released from his contract as FDFC Executive Director. The FDFC Board then ratified the Chairman's suggestion of Mr. Marc Adler as the new Executive Director of FDFC. The FRED Board has had no contact with the FDFC Board or with Mr. Adler as yet.

Pickle Ball Next Steps

We are working with the State on the funding agreement. Emilie and Karla are taking the lead with the Agency. As soon as the agreement has been executed (by the State and the Town Council), we will begin a design/build selection process to secure the contractor. Once the Town Council has approved the design/build agreement with the contractor, we will issue a notice to proceed and the contractor will start construction.
